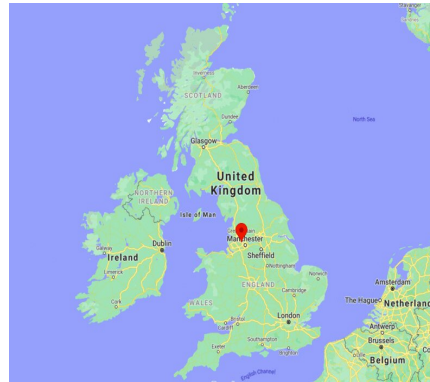


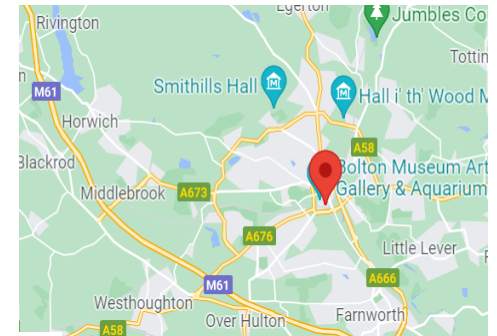
Year 1 – My Local Area (Geography)

Vocabulary	Definitions
Forest	A large area filled with many trees.
Town	A place in which people live and work that is larger than a village but smaller than a city.
Village	A small place that few people live and work.
Human Features	Things that are made or built by humans.
Physical Features	Anything that is on earth naturally.
House	A building that is made for people to live in.
Shop	A building or part of a building where goods or services are sold.
River	A path of water that flows downhill towards an ocean.
Map	An image of an area.
Office	A room or area where people work, usually at a desk.
Direction	Where someone or something is pointing or moving.
Fieldwork	Using maps to go out and about to get a better understanding of something.
Route	How you get from one place to another.
Building	Structures with walls.
School	A place where children go to learn.
