EARLY YEARS PUPIL PREMIUM STATEMENT 2021-2022

The Pupil Premium is additional funding provided to Early Years settings. The funding is additional to main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of 3 and 4 year olds in state funded early education who meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Their family receives one of the following:
 - o Income Support
 - o income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
 - o income-related Employment and Support Allowance
 - o support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - o the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
 - o Child Tax Credit (provided they're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
 - o Working Tax Credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
 - o Universal Credit
- They have been in local-authority care for 1 day or more in England or Wales
- They have been adopted from care in England or Wales
- They have left care under a special guardianship order or residence order in England or Wales

Children for whom we receive Pupil Premium for are referred to as 'disadvantaged' by the government and this funding is provided to close the achievement gap between this group and other children.

Please note: Pupils aged four at the start of the academic year in reception and above are eligible to receive the school age pupil premium and therefore are NOT eligible to receive early years pupil premium funding.
